




Political Environment

Trump and Biden demonstrate similar levels of favorability; Evers is slightly below water




Majority of voters approve of Evers handling of the pandemic— though independents are split




Presidential Vote


A double-digit lead among Wisconsin independents was key to Biden's statewide win.



Biden may have underperformed among Black voters regardless of age; Biden won near universal support from senior white Democrats




About half of Biden support was driven by anti-Trump sentiment; moreover, the coronavirus played a clear role.





Biden's character and approach to the pandemic were key; however, he won few votes based on other key issues like the economy




By contrast, Trump voters show much less concern for keeping Biden out of office



"He made America great again and would continue to do it"


Voters value Trump's ability to stand up for America and his views on the economy; very little faith in his approach to the pandemic



Voting Environment


A majority are confident in the election's outcomes; however this is clearly driven by partisanship

Most voters chose to vote in-person as opposed to absentee, unsurprisingly vote mode fell along partisan lines





In-person voters dealt with long lines and lack of safety compliance, while absentee voters worried about the mail system





Black and Milwaukee County voters most likely to wait in longer lines averaging around 16-20 minutes



Few voters faced problems— for those who did issues were limited to concern for the coronavirus and polling location changes

Biden's campaign appears to have had a slight edge when it comes to outreach


Were you contacted by a campaign or group that encouraged you to vote for Democrat Joe Biden?



Were you contacted by a campaign or group that encouraged you to vote for Republican Donald Trump?




About the same amount of Biden and Trump voters report being encouraged to support their candidate by a friend or family member




Many non-voters cite being unmotivated to vote for either candidate, with fear of COVID coming in second


Once again, Republicans express mistrust for absentee voting

There is concern surrounding absentee voting, stemming from fear of lost or uncounted ballots



Conclusions

Conclusions

Despite a divisive national political environment, most Wisconsinites remain confident in the outcome of the election.

- While a majority (58%) are confident in the election results and process, this heavily falls along partisan lines. This partisan divide stems from skepticism in absentee voting among Republicans.
- Among those who voted, most Americans heard something that gave them concern about absentee ballots in particular.

The election was all about Trump. Biden is valued for his character and views on public health; however, about half of his supporters were more motivated to vote Trump out of office than they were because they liked Biden. By contrast, Trump voters report voting for him as opposed to against Biden in much higher numbers.

- Biden won despite the economy, not because of it. Conversely, a significant amount of voters cite Trump's views on the economy as a reason to vote for him (30%).
- While voters are unsure about Biden when it comes to the economy, they are far more confident in his handling of the pandemic.

Few voters ran into problems when voting—though the fear of the contracting the virus was somewhat present for those who voted in-person—some reports of staff/voters not properly wearing masks.

• The issue of longer lines disproportionately impacting voters of color still remains an issue; however, the actual difference on average does not appear to be significant.

Methodology

Sample

Global Strategy Group conducted a multi-channel survey of **800 Registered Voters in Wisconsin** between November 4-8, 2020. An oversample of 60 Black voters under 45 and 55 Black voters 45+ was included. The majority of interviews were conducted by phone, with supplemental samples of interviews conducted via text-to-web and via online panel matched to the voter file.

The Northwest region is composed of the following DMAs: Minneapolis, La Crosse-Eau Claire, Wausau-Rhinelander.

Due to small sample size, results among nonvoters should be viewed as directional

Margin of error

The margin of error at the 95% confidence level is +/- 3.5%.

The margin of error on sub-samples is greater.
